Kitchen Refurbishment Summary

Key points

- 1. Work starts on 30th November and will be completed in 3 weeks, so visitors in 2016 will be greeted by a lovely new modern kitchen.
- 2. The work will cost only marginally more than the original quotation that Trevor presented in 2012.
- 3. On detailed examination of the existing kitchen
 - a. The base carcasses were in a poorer condition than had been thought.
 - b. The wall units were bowing with the weight of cups & plates and only fixed by 4 screws!
 - c. The floor tiles were showing signs of cracks and damage from items being dropped.
 - d. The wall tiles were cracked in places.
 - e. Some areas of the wall tiles were hardly adhering to the wall.
- 4. The original concept was to have doors custom made to fit the wall cupboards, because they were now non-standard sizes.
- 5. Only one carcass was to be replaced, under the sink, with space then made for the dishwasher.
- 6. The existing tiles would remain.
- 7. The floor would be over-tiled, leaving a (small) ledge at the kitchen entrance.
- 8. In discussion with the kitchen fitters it was apparent that there was a labour cost involved in working round the existing tiles above, around and under the existing carcasses.
- 9. We had the job re-quoted on the basis of ...
 - a. All new carcasses
 - b. All new full-sized wall cupboards
 - c. Removing the wall tiles and plastering, with a splash back as in a modern kitchen
 - d. Removing the floor tiles and tiling level with the current living room, using hard wearing tiles.
 - e. At the fitter's suggestion, they also added some extra power points and a couple of kitchen unit lights.
- 10. In the end, mostly because of the shift in exchange rate, the final quotation came in at less than £900 more than we had budgeted originally.
- 11. We secured the exchange rate by moving funds to Spain at that rate straight away.
- 12. There are sufficient reserves to cover the full costs without asking for more cash from members.
- 13. On that basis we went ahead and commissioned the work, and David & Richard have agreed to oversee the workmen during the project.

Note – thanks to Trevor for all of his work in getting the project off the ground and selecting a good kitchen installation company, and choosing a nice modern look for the kitchen.
